< Page. 5 >

이야기가 시작 되는 부분입니다.

Floppy was dreaming that he was in the jungle.

플로피가 무엇을 하고 있는지, 다른 등장인물은 무엇을 하고 있는지 이야기해 보세요.
그리고 그림에 등장하는 여러 가지 물건들에 대해서도 질문해 보세요.

- : What is Floppy doing? / He is sleeping and dreaming.
- : Where was Floppy in his dream? / Floppy was in the jungle.
- : What are the other people doing? / They are having a birthday party.
- : What kind of decorations are there? / There are some balloons, and some flowers.

< Page. 6,7 >

A tiger jumped out.

“Got you!” he said.

“I can trick a tiger,” said Floppy.

호랑이와 마주친 플로피가 당황하지 않고 호랑이를 속이려고 하는 부분입니다.
스토리에 관련된 내용을 활용해 보세요.

또 I Got you! 같은 표현을 이용해서 아이와 함께 놀이도 해 보세요.

: Can you describe the tiger? / The tiger has stripes, sharp nails, and sharp teeth.

: What other animals do you see? / A monkey, rabbit, and a snake.

: Did Floppy get scared? / No, he didn't.

: Why? / Because he can trick the tiger.

“Look out!” said Floppy.

“There's a bee on your nose.”

“Oh no!” said the tiger, and he let Floppy go.

플로피가 호랑이를 속이고 달아나는 부분입니다.
스토리와 관련된 질문해 보세요.

: How did Floppy trick the tiger? / He said there's a bee on the tiger's nose.

: Have you ever seen a bee? / Yes, I have / No, I haven't.

: Have you ever been stung by a bee? / Yes, I have/ No, I haven't.

< Page. 10,11,12,13 >

A crocodile jumped out.

“Got you!” she said.

“I can trick a crocodile,” said Floppy.

“Look out!” said Floppy.

“There’s a bee on your nose.”

“Oh no!” said the crocodile, and she let Floppy go.

플로피가 악어를 만나서 일어나는 일입니다.

호랑이와 같은 방법으로 악어를 속이고 도망가는 내용입니다.

: What kind of animal did Floppy meet? / He met a crocodile.

: What is the crocodile trying to do? / The crocodile is trying to eat Floppy.

: Do you see any other animals? / There is a snake, a parrot, a frog, a deer, a gecko, and a bee.

그림을 설명할 수 있도록 유도해 보세요.

: What is the crocodile doing? / The crocodile is biting Floppy’s tail.

: How does Floppy trick the crocodile? / Floppy says there’s a bee on the crocodile’s nose.

A snake slid out. “Got you!” she said.

“I can trick a snake,” said Floppy.

“Look out!” said Floppy.

“There’s a bee on your nose.”

“Oh no!” said the snake, and she let Floppy go.

이번에는 플로피가 정글에서 뱀을 만났습니다.
호랑이, 악어에게 했던 방법으로 뱀을 속이는 내용입니다.

이 페이지에서는 여러가지 동물이 등장합니다.
동물의 이름이 무엇인지, 또 동물의 행동에 대해서 간단하게 표현해 보세요.

: What kind of animal did Floppy met this time? / Floppy met a snake.

: What color is the snake? / The snake is green.

이런식으로 자세한 묘사를 할 수 있도록 유도해 보세요.

: How did Floppy trick the snake? / He said there's a bee on the snake's nose.

: What kinds of animal do you see? What are they doing?

: There is a bat. It is flying.

: There is a hippopotamus. It is swimming.

: There is a swan. It is swimming.

: There is a frog. It is jumping around.

< Page 18, 19, 20 >

A rabbit jumped out, “Got you!” said Floppy.

“Look out!” said the rabbit.

“There's a bee on your nose.” BUUuuUUZ!

“Oh no!” said Floppy.

스토리의 결말 부분입니다. 정글에서 토끼를 만난 플로피는 토끼를 잡으려고 합니다.
하지만 플로피의 코에 진짜 벌이 앉았습니다. 놀란 플로피는 꿈에서 깹니다.

: What kind of animal did Floppy met? / He met a rabbit.

: Is the rabbit trying to get Floppy? / No, Floppy is trying to get the rabbit.

: What happened? / There's a real bee on Floppy's nose.

Think about the story

- Why did the tiger let Floppy go?
(호랑이는 왜 플러피를 놔주었나요?)

→ The tiger let Floppy go because he thought there was a bee on his nose and tried to catch the bee.

(호랑이는 그의 코에 벌이 앉은 줄 알았고 그 벌을 잡으려고 했기 때문에 플러피를 놔주었어요.)

- What would you do if you had a bee on your nose?
(만약 당신의 코에 벌이 앉았다면 어떻게 할 건가요?)

→ 예) If I had a bee on my nose I would try to get rid of it.
(만약 제 코에 벌이 앉았다면 전 그것을 없애려고 할거예요.)

- How do you think Floppy felt when the bee landed on his nose?
(벌이 플러피의 코에 앉았을 때, 플러피의 기분은 어땠을 것 같나요?)

→ When the bee landed on Floppy's nose he might have gotten scared. (벌이 플러피의 코에 앉았을 때, 그는 아마 무서웠을 거예요.)

- Have you ever played a trick on anybody? Was it a funny trick?
(누군가에게 장난을 쳐 본적이 있나요? 웃긴 장난이었나요?)

→ 예) Yes, I have. Yes, it was very funny. I told my little sister that there was a ghost behind her.

(네, 있어요. 네, 아주 재미있었어요. 전 제 여동생에게 뒤에 귀신이 있다고 말했어요.)
